- Systemic cost drivers, including commercial insurance practices, administrative burdens, and Medicaid and Medicare payments not keeping pace with the cost of care – harming patient access



HOW YOU CAN HELP

State government and local lawmakers are key partners in providing high-quality, affordable, and accessible care to every patient.

Support Accessible Healthcare

- Keep hospitals sustainable so they can continue contributing to healthy communities and a strong economy
- Remove barriers to healthcare access by improving the state's Certificate of Need (CON) process
- Collaborate to ensure that the state Medicaid program pays rates that cover the cost of care
- Support policies that address unfair insurance practices that create barriers to care
- Oppose policies that would further strain hospitals, such as cost growth benchmark penalties, arbitrary caps on commercial payments, site-neutral payment cuts, and further restrictions on facility fees, which would reduce access to critical healthcare services, especially in underserved communities

Support Healthcare Workers

- Continue collaborative efforts to stop workplace violence
- Bolster hospitals' recruitment and retention efforts to address the critical healthcare workforce shortage

Support Vulnerable Communities

- Partner with hospitals to advance health equity, improve maternal health outcomes, and address social drivers of health, such as access to affordable housing and nutritious food. This includes reimagining Medicaid to invest in local communities and preventive care programs, enhancing the health of people for generations to come
- Invest in behavioral health services and care
- Protect the 340B Drug Pricing Program to ensure access to more affordable prescription drugs and programs that support underserved communities
- Address unfair health insurance company practices, like burdensome prior authorization policies, that reduce access to care
